A Message from STEPHEN VASKO

This past Advent season was filled with many messages, including hope, peace, joy, and love. In this article, I wish to focus on an often-overlooked aspect of Advent: humility.

This has been a key aspect of my past semester in seminary. Like many, a challenge that I face is pride. I find it far too easy to think too highly of myself. This also creates a strange effect, in which I become overly hard on myself to maintain this false image. Much like the wise men of today's gospel, I was fortunate to meet Christ, who showed me humility. For after all, we hear him say in Matthew 11, "Come to me...for I am meek and humble of heart." A large portion of work must first be done by others in order for us to come to Christ. I once heard that we should pray for embarrassment, and I stand by that. To approach Christ, we must take a step of humility, as the wise men did in today's gospel, who approached a child whom they recognized as greater than themselves and gave him gifts. So too must we realize that there is something greater here than ourselves.

Others help us recognize that we are putting on masks to hide our shame and failure and to prop ourselves up. This has been a crucial role played by my brothers in formation and the faculty at the seminary. As they have pointed out my masks,



which allows me to turn to Christ, who will guide me to who I am supposed to be. He builds me up with strength just as He did with Mary. During the annunciation, Mary gave her consent to God, who, in turn, prepared her for her role as the Mother of God through her immaculate conception. It is because of her yes that God granted this, not the other way around. So too will he give us the strength, hope, peace, joy, and love that we need to carry out His will in our lives.

This Advent season and now this Christmas season are all about humility; after all, I can think of nothing more humble than God becoming man. Thus, I encourage you, my brothers and sisters, to consider what masks you live with and to turn them over to the Lord to make good their defects.

God bless and have a very merry Christmas.

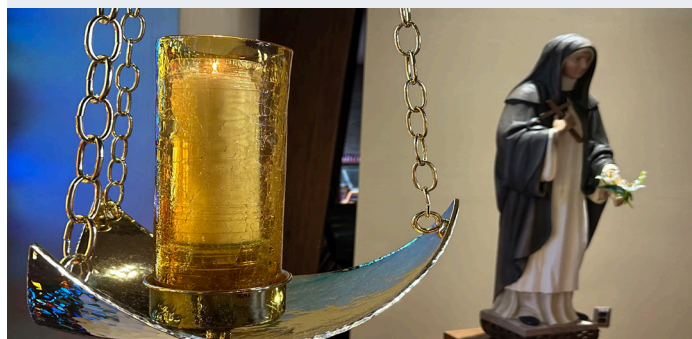

PARISH ENVELOPES FOR THE MONTH OF JANUARY

You should have received your monthly envelope packets for January.

If you haven't received the new envelopes and would like to, or if you have received the envelopes but do not wish to, please contact the parish office so we can address the issue.

Our aim is to help you understand the purpose of each envelope as we progress together as one parish.

January Envelopes will include:

1. Sunday Collection Envelopes

These envelopes contribute to the operational costs of both church campuses.

2. Monthly Donation Blessings Envelope

To help minimize envelope costs, this envelope will feature multiple giving options. Please make sure you mark the checkboxes to indicate where you wish your donation to go:

a. Early Childhood Learning Center - These funds support the administrative costs associated with our ECLCs, as well as the housing and utility expenses for both St. Luke and St. Charles ECLC facilities.

b. Security - Contributions to this fund help cover security expenses during all weekend Masses as well help offset the cost for the expenses for other security systems, such as cameras.

c. Capital Fund - Donations to this fund enable the parish to maintain and finance improvements for both church grounds.

3. Catholic Echo Magazine Envelope

This envelope is distributed annually to assist in covering the monthly subscription cost for each parishioner to receive the Catholic Echo. We kindly ask for a \$15.00 contribution to help offset this expense.

4. Initial Offering Envelope

This envelope is distributed annually, and the funds collected assist in covering the yearly printing costs.

5. Church Overseas Envelope

This combined collection supports four major overseas services: Catholic Relief Services (CRS), Holy Father/Peter's Pence, the Church in Central and Eastern Europe, and the Church in Latin America.

6. Mens Club/Holy Name Society Envelope

This annual envelope is designed for individuals associated with these specific ministries, allowing them to conveniently pay their yearly dues.

7. Educational Endowment Fund Envelope

This envelope will be distributed every quarter, and the funds collected will be deposited into a designated bank account to assist in covering tuition costs for St. Charles School.
