

A Message From

Sister Mary Hyce

As I reflected on the setting of the Baptism of Jesus this weekend, I find it also inspiring that not only one of the three Persons of the Trinity were present for this event i. e., Jesus, but all three Persons were there. Jesus, of course was the focal point. The people were waiting for Jesus to appear and some even thought that John the Baptist was the "star" of this historical happening. But John makes it clear that Jesus was coming with a New Baptism, not the baptism of water that they had all expected. Jesus was coming to baptize with the Holy Spirit. Jesus was in the Jordan River with John the Baptist, who affirmed "that one mightier than I is coming". And "I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals." The crowd, too, including Jesus, received this baptism by John and it was then that the theophany (manifestation) of God in Three Persons was visible to all who were gathered. "The Holy Spirit descended like a dove so that all who were present could see and the Father spoke from heaven so that all could hear "You are my beloved Son; with You I am well pleased." God is not speaking to the crowd but He is speaking directly to Jesus. YOU are my Son. God the Father affirmed Jesus' mission to establish justice on the earth, i.e., to bring about the Reign of God: to "open the eyes of the blind, to bring prisoners from confinement and to release those from the dungeon of darkness in which they live." (Is. 42: 1-7) Although it is not in today's first reading, Isaiah goes on to say in verse 9 "earlier things have come to pass, new ones I now declare". The mission is alive.

Isaiah outlined the plan for bringing about the Reign of God in the world...then and now. As baptized Christians we, too, are called to continue this call to establish peace and justice in the world. St. Catherine of Siena lived this vision, too. She said "Living a life of witness to Christ is not easy, but in the end, it will lead to something great."

So how do we begin at the start of the new year and the foundation of a new parish? May I offer a few suggestions? Some may be easier than others but they are a start. If each of us starts with one, the witness will expand in 2025. First, expand your mind through attempting to do something that you are not ordinarily used to doing: try a new hobby, read a book, listen to podcasts that inspire, join a group that calls you to something more than you are now. Second, give back to some person or some group. Service is one way of sharing in the lives of others as well as providing a new perspective on giving of ourselves. And third, building relationships is vital in order to share the ups and downs of life. Meeting new people and sharing common interests is life-giving to all involved. It is amazing that we so often find that we are more alike than different. Let's work together as a church to expand and enliven the wisdom of St. Catherine of Siena in our new parish.

As of this writing, the plan for Saint Luke and St. Charles churches is to create one weekly St. Catherine of Siena Parish bulletin for both parishes. The plan is for this to begin next weekend, so look for it. It may take a little bit of tweaking at the beginning but I ask that we all be patient as we work to create "something new". This is a process that we're taking slowly to bring everyone along on the journey.

Thank you to all who helped to create a beautiful Christmas environment in the church and chapel. I received many compliments on the simplicity and beauty of the arrangements. Our weekly liturgies and homilies have been inspiring and hopeful as we create St. Catherine of Siena Parish. Thank you for the support you give to me and to one another. We are blessed.

Social Concerns: In Service to Others

Social Concerns Ministry has a history of community outreach. We started with school supplies for the students of Saint Luke, coat collection and helping with utility bills. Then came the Pantry along with members making kits for the people who were homeless, blankets, and collecting household items. When needed we assisted with Diocesan collections to Change Lives, Rescue Mission collection of towels and Ursuline Sisters AIDs Ministry to name a few.

We are ever so grateful for your generous donations to our Ministry - gifts for the Giving Tree and especially the monetary envelopes which allow us to continue the Paper Pantry Plus. In 2024, we distributed 5268 items consisting of 586 items each of four packs of toilet paper, body wash, dish soap, paper towels and 590 boxes of tissues. There were also 893 cleaning products and 855 grooming and hygiene products in the bags. An average of 50 bags were distributed each month with an average of a little less than three individuals per household. With increasing prices in some items over the last year, we will limit to 50 bags each month and reduce the individual choice from 3 extra items to two for 2025. At his time, we would like to thank Paula Lehman for Chairing in 2024, the OCIA Candidates, Molly Slaina and family and George Garchar for helping with distributing bags on Sunday.


