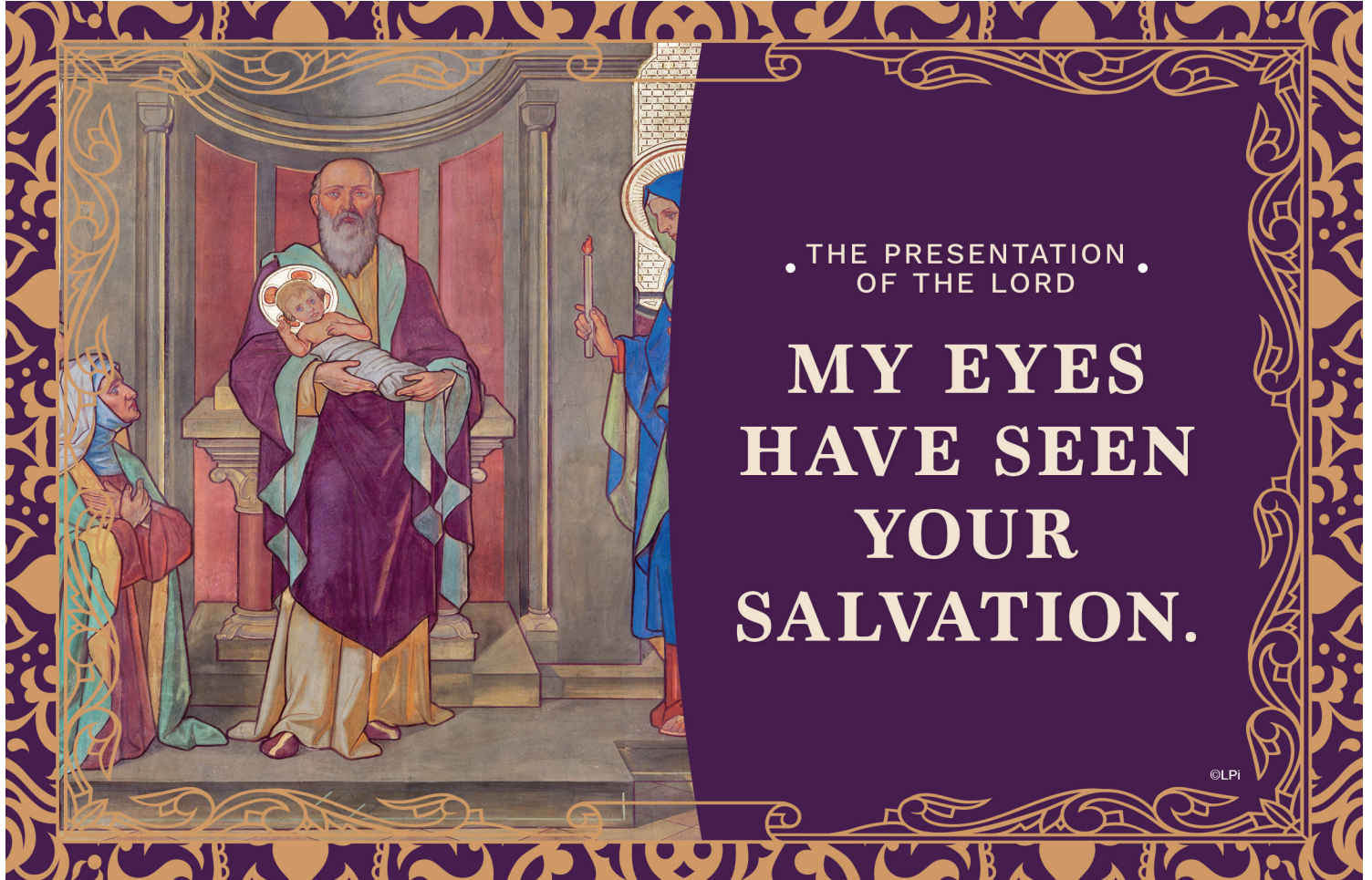

A Message from SR. MARY ALYCE KOVAL

In today's gospel story from Luke, we hear about Simeon, a "righteous man" who lived in Jerusalem and who was promised by the Holy Spirit that he would not die until he saw the Messiah, the Promised One of Israel. Luke tells us that Joseph and Mary bring the child Jesus to the Temple for the ritual presentation to take place 40 days after the birth of a child. Simeon joyously proclaims that he is "ready to go in peace" because his eyes have seen the salvation promised by God. We hear about Anna, a prophetess in Israel, who also sees Mary and Joseph and announces to those in the Temple that this child was significant in the story of salvation.

Now the Temple of Jerusalem was a busy place. We can be sure that many people would have noticed this young Jewish couple, Mary and Joseph, bringing their child to be presented before the Lord. Hundreds of people looked at Jesus, but only Simeon and Anna understood his significance. These two characters from the gospel, then, remind us of the essential difference between looking and seeing, between observing and understanding. How often this happens in our own lives too. Did you ever go into a place or event and then, when you leave, try to recall who was there? Our minds are drawn into so much activity around us that we miss the details that sometimes tell us the "real story".



We can live daily in our families and never notice the acts of care and kindness that are provided by our spouse or by our parent. We can overlook how a child or a brother or sister is always trying to be the peacemaker or the helper. And because we do not really see these actions of care, service and peacemaking and the love that lies behind them, we are not able to affirm that love and celebrate it. Our relationships suffer as a consequence. We can cooperate regularly with people at work or church, joining with them on effective projects. We can spend hours texting our friends, talking to them after class, or going out with them on the weekends. Although we regularly look at these co-workers and friends, we can fail to see a cry for help. We are busy looking but we fail to see. We can fail to see how they are waiting to tell us something, ask us for our time and assistance. And because we fail to see that need, we

miss the opportunity of being the agents of Christ's presence in their lives.

Simeon and Anna were able to recognize God's presence in the infant Christ. They invite us to recognize God's presence in our lives, too. They ask us to slow down, to look deeper, to recognize all the opportunities that lie around us. There are people in our lives loving us, whom we should not take for granted. There are people needing us, whom we should not ignore. We are surrounded by opportunities to give thanks and to serve. But in order to discover them, we must do more than look. We must be willing to see. May St. Catherine of Siena, be our guide.

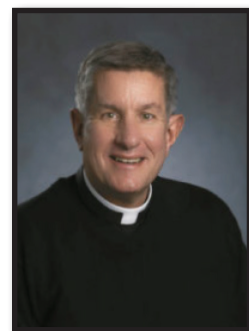
Homebound and Nursing Home Ministry

Why does the music at Mass always change?

Traditionally, Mass settings change during the various liturgical seasons of the year. Mass settings are musical compositions for the prayers in the Catholic Mass. Songs that are included in the Mass settings usually include the *Gloria, Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy), Agnus Dei (Lamb of God), Gospel Alleluia, and the Great Amen.*

Music directors change the Mass Settings seasonally to create a feeling for the season. For example, Mass settings for funerals are often solemn or somber while Mass settings for Easter are often joyful.

The various Mass settings for St. Charles Church can be found in the *Breaking Bread*, beginning with number 831 and for St. Luke Church can be found in *Today's Missal* beginning with number 831 or

Gather 4 number 224.

During this early season in Ordinary Time, St. Charles Church is using the Heritage Mass Setting by Owen Alstott, while St. Luke Church is using the Mass of Spirit and Grace by Ricky Manalo. The Heritage Mass Setting can be found in the *Breaking Bread*, number 872. Mass of Spirit and Grace Setting can be found in *Today's Missal* number 906.

In addition, the psalm response after the first reading at Mass changes to support the message of the first reading. It is not the same response each weekend.

We invite everyone to join us in exploring the relevant books and discovering the new Mass settings.
