A Message from DN. MIKE KOCJANCIC THESE 40 DAYS OF LENT, O LORD

If you were accused of being a Christian, would there be enough evidence to convict you? When I was teaching in the high school, I was always fascinated on Ash Wednesday by the number of faculty and students I would see with ashes on their foreheads. I would wonder why on just this one day of the year I could tell they were Christian; what about the other 179 days we taught? Lent is more than just about receiving 'freebies' such as ashes and palms or giving something up. There is so much more to Lent than these outward signs.

Many cultures in Old Testament times had religious rituals for cleansing or purifying, ways to show your sorrow for the times you were less than perfect. In the early Catholic Church, these rituals revolved around the Sacrament of Baptism, which was administered only to adults and only at the Easter Vigil. Serious sins were confessed, penance was done over a long period of time, you were assigned special seats and wore special clothing to identify yourself as one seeking repentance. It was after all these things were complete (which could take several years) that you were absolved and became Catholic. Already baptized Christians noticed this ritual and joined in out of solidarity. Soon, the rituals of Lent (from an Old English word meaning to lengthen) were practiced by all. So there is a two-fold purpose to Lent, for those preparing for Baptism, and for others to renew their baptismal promises to live the path God has prepared.



Lent has always been a time of penitence, recognizing our shortcomings, but also the potential each of us has inside. As time moved on, more interest was shown in the trials and sufferings of Jesus and we wanted to emulate this suffering. We children of God need outward signs to show our internal life, so we began 'giving up' something we liked or enjoyed to show our readiness to detach ourselves from the ways of the world to follow God's ways. But human nature being what it is, this practice began to be abused. Giving up took on a publicity stunt atmosphere, seeing who could give up the most because that would make you appear 'holier' than others and therefore, closer to God.

Pope Saint Paul 6th wrote that we should give up those things that make us self-centered, that keep us overly attached to the ways of the world. But then he adds that having given up unwanted earthly attachments, we now have 'more room' in our souls to take up the things and ways of God. We should not focus on how much we give up, but instead what to give up that we spend all

our time pursuing instead of the path of enlightenment God has laid for us. By removing those things distracting from God, we can devote more time to the traditional three cornerstones of Lent. By (1) **fasting** from the allures of the world, we can give more time to (2) **pray** and reflect and leads to more opportunities in (3) **almsgiving** to help ease the needs of the world. Give up in order to take in!

TRIVIA: Why the color purple? In the ancient Roman Empire, this color was used in the southern regions a sign of nobility, while in the northern regions for sorrow. In the 12th century Church, the meanings were combined to show the noblest among us (Jesus) had to suffer the most for us to open the gates of heaven (Christ).

Also Lent technically ends at the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday evening when the Triduum begins, the three holiest days of the Church year, (1) Thursday night to Friday night (2) then to Saturday night (3) and on to Sunday night.

Upon the death of Pope Gregory XI, Urban VI was elected by the cardinals of Rome as his successor. However, the Cardinals of Avignon, France elected Antipope Clement VII. Clement was recognized by France, Spain, Scotland, and Naples. Urban was recognized by North Italy, Poland, England, Flanders, and Hungary. Catherine was summoned to try to heal this schism by maintaining obedience to Urban as he was the legitimate head of the Church.
