

We celebrate St. Patrick today, March 17. Saint Patrick, who lived during the fifth century, is the patron saint of Ireland and its national apostle. Born in Roman Britain, he was kidnapped and brought to Ireland as a slave at 16. He later escaped, but returned to Ireland and was credited as bringing Christianity to its people. A few interesting facts: He wasn't actually Irish and wore blue not green. The Irish symbol of the shamrock was popularized by him and legend says that he used the shamrock to teach the mystery of the Trinity... three persons in one God.

Another important saint in the Catholic registry is St. Joseph. Not much is known about him except the stories that we hear mostly around Christmas time. He was the earthly father of Jesus and the spouse of Mary. He was a carpenter by trade and was a man full of trust and humility in these roles. There is no record of any spoken words of Joseph but he was a faithful provider for his family. St. Joseph's feast day is March 19 and he is the patron saint of workers, especially carpenters, fathers, expectant mothers and unborn children, among others.

The St. Anthony Novena begins on Tuesday, March 19 and continues for 13 Tuesdays until June 11. It will be prayed after 8:00 a.m. mass. Beginning on March 19, 8:00 a.m. mass on Tuesdays will be held in the church to accommodate the additional people coming for the novena. I invite everyone to sit in sections 4 and 5 (on the left as you enter the church).

Thank you to Gene McCarragher for his beautiful and creative representations of the Life of Christ. I was amazed at the reaction of those of you who stopped to walk through the exhibit. The look on the faces of those who stopped to read the captions and study the paintings was a prayer in itself.

In addition to the many other representations of art in our church and on our grounds, I.e., the garden, this was another example of how the truth, beauty and goodness of God and life enriches our prayer. Take time to appreciate what God lays before us and use our gifts to spread the Gospel. This is evangelization.

Next weekend is Palm Sunday and it begins the holiest week of the Church year. If you are able to stand and walk without effort, we will gather in the narthex before mass and process into the church waving palms branches and singing "Hosanna" to the Son of David". Red is the liturgical color for Palm Sunday so if you have a red sweater or shirt, please wear it. The Triduum on Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday complete the story of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus. Those days comprise one continuous liturgy. Plan to join us.

Did you know?

- ---The majority of palm branches used in North American churches for Palm Sunday come from the Florida Everglades, undeveloped Florida land, Texas, and the Gulf Coast of Mexico.
- --Because the palm branches used for Palm Sunday have been blessed by a priest, they are a sacramental. They may be returned to church the following Lent or be burned or buried to discard them.
- --Before the Palm Sunday Mass, the palms are solemnly blessed. Parishioners are directed to wave their palms as they and the priest process in, and they are encouraged to hold their palms throughout the reading of the Passion.
- --Palms have also been recognized as a symbol of peace, victory, and eternal life.






