

Easter isn't a single day or even a single church service; it's an entire season concluding with the feast of Pentecost. The celebration of Easter is spread over the course of 50 days; that's how long it takes to unpack the glorious mystery of Easter: the passion, death, and resurrection of Christ. Now we have 50 days to reflect on the gift of the resurrection, to pray and to sing Alleluia. Why so much celebration? Because of the salvation Jesus gained for us by his sacrifice and victory on the cross. Through that great gift, we have been given new life through the Holy Spirit.

To express appreciation for the hours of planning and preparation that went into helping to make the Holy Week liturgies prayerful and inspirational for all who attended any or all of them would be futile. The attendance at all of the liturgies was itself an expression of the faith of the church community of Saint Luke. We had several visitors and family members who celebrated with us during the week. It was so good to welcome them to pray with us. Thank you to Msgr. Zuraw and Fr. Steve for leading us in the liturgies and rituals of the week. The many ministers of music, the Word, the Eucharist, the environment, the servers, the Knights, the set-up and take-down, those who said Yes on Holy Thursday for the foot-washing, the women who prayerfully presented the gifts at the altar, the servers, the office staff and any others I may have forgotten to name, and all who attended and participated in the liturgies as full conscious, and active participants, which, of course, is what it is all about.

Pentecost is on May 19 which will end the Easter season in the church. May 19 is also the day of our annual SPRING THING so reserve the date. Stay alert for more information about this year's celebration.

As mentioned a few weeks ago in this column, St. Charles and other parishes in Mahoning County are hoping to form bocce teams of young adults (ages 20-40, married or single) to play once a week for six weeks starting on Monday, April 15 and ending on May 20 here at the Saint Luke bocce courts. This is a simple and meaningful family-centered hands-on service project that will bring joy to the builders as well as to the dozens of children who do not have beds to sleep on in their homes. 
