## A Message from DN MIKE KOCJANCIC BLESSED IS HE Reflections on Palm Sunday

When I was younger, besides wanting to be a cowboy (not a very wise career choice in Warren, Ohio in the 1950s), I wanted to be a priest. Unlike so many others in our parish the family attended, holy week was one of my favorite times of a church year because it was so different from all other services. Yes, it was longer. Yes, it was not Mass as usual, but that's what fascinated me even to this day. I have the sense of wonder and thankfulness for all Jesus was willing to go through for my sake. And so we begin this most special of all weeks with "Olive" Sunday.

That's what it could've been called instead of Palm Sunday. In the near east at that time, it was the custom to cover the path of someone worthy of high honor, and to this crowd that gathered that day, they knew Jesus was someone worthy. Branches of common trees were thrown down on the roadway as a sign of respect and the most common trees in the holy land were palm and olive. In those countries where palms are not locally grown, branches of trees native to that area are used such as willow or yew trees. (In the United States palms are grown and shipped from Texas.) Many parishioners will take their palms home and place them by their crucifixes, by pictures or in their Bible or prayer book. So why did it end up being called Palm Sunday? While all four gospels tell of this triumphant entry into Jerusalem, it is only the gospel of John that specifically mentions palms.

But ironically at the same

time, in the ancient religions of Egypt the palm was carried in funeral processions as a sign of eternal life. So here we have an interesting situation symbolically; Jesus is entering triumphantly as a person of honor, but it is a procession, later that same week, will lead to his death on a cross.

It is also interesting that Jesus rides a donkey during this entry and again the symbolism behind this is significant. In the eastern tradition, a ruler would ride a horse as symbol of war into battle, and then once peace was obtained, would change and ride a donkey, a symbol of peace. How appropriate that this bringer of peace would only ride a donkey in procession.

I wonder how many in the crowd that day will six days later be in a different crowd, calling for the same man to be put to death by crucifixion? It was the most horrible way to die, so horrendous that Roman citizens were not permitted to be crucified but only outsiders such as this man from Nazareth. What swayed the crowd

that day? Did outside influencers have a part in this? Or in those six days between his triumph entry and now his questioning, did they decide not to like the message of the kingdom of peace that was being proclaimed by Jesus, as they were looking for a way to violently overthrow the Romans?

As we go about our daily lives, how do we live to show Jesus the honor he deserves? We can do it by making Jesus the center of our lives. Or are we so easily swayed by the ways of the Earth and the opinions of others that we forget we are all his children and need to live as brothers and sisters? Even in the most ordinary, common mundane, we're trying times of our lives, do we do it for our own glory honor so that people think highly of us, or do it because he deserves our glory and honor? It is our choice and we need to choose wisely.

Blessed it is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Dear Parishioners of Saint Catherine of Siena Parish,

At some point in our lives, we have heard the phrase “change is the only constant.” Yet in practice, many of us find change very difficult. Change can be scary, especially when we are unsure of what the future holds. Yet we take comfort in the words from the Epistle of Hebrews that “Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow.”

The changing demographics, personnel shortage and diminished religious practice have necessitated the restructuring of all of our parishes. Presently there are 44 priests ministering to 68 parishes. The number of Catholics in our region has (have) decreased in proportion to population by 25%. Churches once full are now empty shells of what they once were. We can long for the good old days, or we can ask ourselves, “What is God’s plan and what must we do next?”

The Diocesan Pastoral Plan is a process to best arrange all of the diocesan resources to address this particular place and time within the diocese. As Church we must focus our energy, passion and zeal, not on what was, but on what can be, while at the same time seeking to live in the reality of the moment.

Therefore, we the leadership of St. Catherine of Siena Parish write to inform you that as of July 1, 2025, only one priest will be assigned to the parish and we, the present leadership, will be moving on to new ministerial opportunities.

This change will require the office location to be centralized, a reduction from six Masses to four on the weekends, one daily Mass and a realignment of responsibilities of the current staff.

As a parish we must remind ourselves to be Eucharist centered. As a parish we must uncover the presence of God in our lives. As a parish we must move beyond personal wants and securities. St. Paul reminds us “whoever is in Christ is a new creation, the old things have passed away and behold new things have come.”

Please know that as the present leadership team of St. Catherine of Siena Parish, we will work very hard to make this transition as smooth as possible.

## A Note from the Pastor

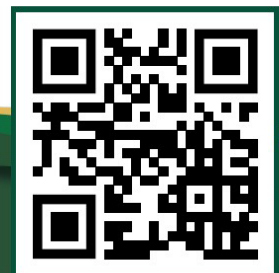
