We all know "the rest of the story" of Easter Sunday. It is no wonder that Mary Magdalene and Peter and John and the other disciples did not know what to think about their Lord and Master "rising from the dead" because they were living it in "real time" not in hindsight. Do we blame Thomas for not believing before he could put his hand in the wounds of Jesus body? How could all this be happening when even those closest to Jesus, who walked and talked with him every day, found it hard to believe? Later that first Easter evening, two of the disciples were walking along the road to Emmaus when a stranger appeared and began to discuss what had just happened in Jerusalem. Even then the disciples did not recognize Jesus until he took the bread and blessed, broke and shared it with them. Ah-ha! That is what Jesus did on the night before he died! Now they believed because they could see and they remember. In today's gospel (Lk 24: 35-48) we pick up the story immediately after the Emmaus revelation. Jesus comes to them through the door of the room where they were staying. With this, Jesus affirms their belief in what they witnessed as he recounts these events and fulfilled the words of Moses and the prophets that all these things would take place and they would be witnesses to everything said about Him. Now, we have faith to recognize Jesus in The Eucharist, in The Word and in each other, just as Jesus told the disciples and tells us today.
