

The Gospel for today is the familiar reading on the Good Shepherd. Most people reading this passage have had no experience with tending sheep, but it is important to keep in mind that this passage from Scripture is about relationships. Building relationships that nourish.

On Thursday, April 4, 2024, the staff from Saint Charles Parish and Saint Luke Parish gathered for a day of getting to know one another better. It was a day of building relationships. We were reminded that a good staff knows that it is best to lead from the back, gently nudging the parish toward the future.

In preparation for our merger, we named our strengths, struggles, opportunities and threats as staff and as parish.

What are the strengths as a staff? Saint Luke reported that they collaborate well, excellent communication (quick to respond to inquiries), all ministries are covered with 2 FT staff and 4 PT staff and that they all enjoy working together. As a parish they see themselves with a strong sense of community, welcoming, social and vibrant, strong music program, lots of participation, beautiful environment, generous and in a strong financial position.

St. Charles reported that they are dedicated and moving forward sharing their gifts and talents, experienced, right people in the right job working together to accomplish tasks, and that they have the hearts of servants. As a parish they see themselves as a large community with many opportunities to reach out, strong core of volunteers, staff members are parishioners and have a camaraderie among themselves.

What are the struggles as a staff? Saint Luke reported a smaller size, a need for more opportunities to grow our ministries, don't see each other often but come together when necessary. As a parish they are aging, fewer younger volunteers, location is not in a neighborhood, and a lack of "hands-on" ministries.

St. Charles reported a weakness of inner communications among staff, a lack of communication between the school and parish and its large size. As a parish there is not enough volunteers, apathy, communication and an appearance of "unfriendliness."

What are the opportunities for both parishes? New ministries, to be a model for other merging parishes, increase volunteer pool, shared use of properties, more opportunities to worship with a sharing of the weekend Mass schedule, gentle invitation for parish groups to collaborate, coordinate supplies, skills and contracts, opportunities for spiritual renewal, both parishes are in good financial positions, unified impact on the Boardman community.

What are the threats or fears? What don't we want to lose as a staff? Saint Luke reported a fear of losing Sister Mary Alyce, job changes, will CCD change, the loss of parish identity, will one place close. St. Charles reported the discomfort of the unknown, duplication of staff expectations, will there be resistance, scheduling, a concern for stepping on each other's toes.

What are the parish's fears or challenges? Both staffs agreed on the following: fear of combining finances "My sandbox, my toys," fear of losing parishioners and a loss of personal connections, a fear of losing our identity.

As one parish we have the opportunity to create a new parish just as our ancestors did for Saint Luke some 62 years ago and for St. Charles 98 years ago. With this in mind you are invited to attend a parish-wide listening session on Thursday, May 16 at 6:30 p.m. in Saint Luke Church to share what you see as our strengths, struggles, opportunities and threats. Please plan to join us.


