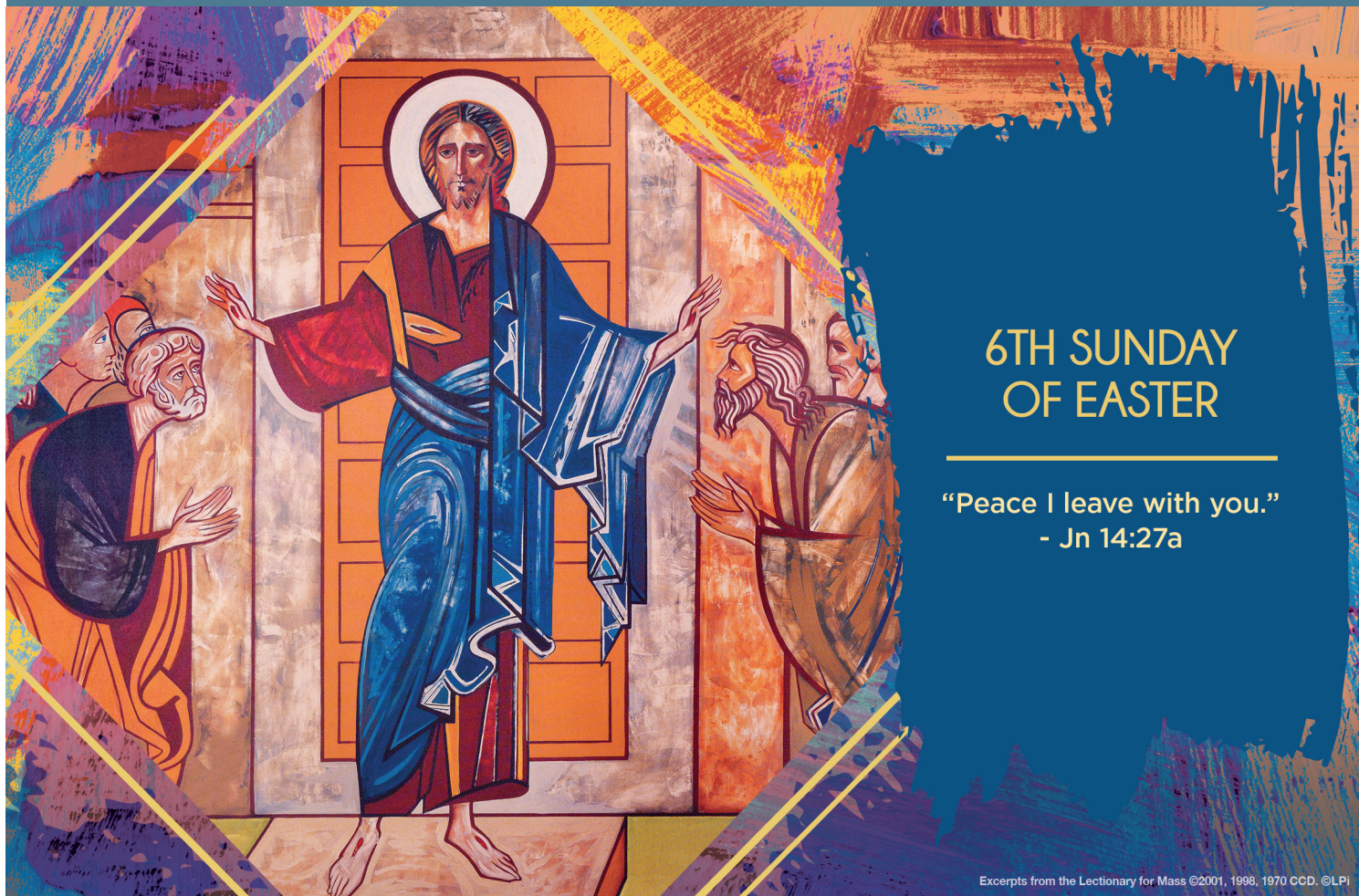

A Message from DEACON MIKE River of Time

I love Science-fiction films/TV shows with a time-travel theme. I am always curious to see how the writers handle the problems of going back to the past or ahead to the future. Do we change something accidentally in the past that has changed the present when we've return? Or does something we do in the future change the present that will then change the future we visited which will no longer be the future to affect the present that has changed? Confusing, isn't it?

Time is fascinating. When I was younger, I was among those who thought I was in control of time – please, mom, let me stay up one more hour, or that event better not start until I get there, Things in the past can be memorable and we try to hold to those moments as long as we can, especially the good moments. Things in the past can also be unpleasant and we try (and often fail) to stop thinking of them; I still vividly recall the Thanksgiving morning of 1981 when a freak accident sent me to the hospital.

In the same way, the future can appear pleasant – I can't wait to see my eldest granddaughter graduate from high school. But future can also appear unpleasant – how will this illness affect my getting around or what I had planned on doing later? We can make all kinds of plans for the future but there is always the chance that something will happen to alter those carefully planned events. We can plan for 'A' future, but not 'THE' future. John Cardinal Neuman, the English theologian who died in 1890, once wrote, "I do not ask to see the distant shore, one



step is enough for me." That's become my prayer, to simply do God's will once I get up each morning.

Of course, God being God, time doesn't matter as God belongs to all times. Notice how God replied to Moses' question, "What shall I say to Pharaoh when he asks who sent me?" God answered, "I AM who am." God did not say I WAS or I WILL BE, but I AM for God is eternal; the God of our yesterdays and is the God of our todays and will be the God of our tomorrows.

I write this well aware of the changes we have been facing in light of the clerical shortage in the Diocese. We've lived through being separate parishes, then collaborating, and now merging as a new parish, St. Catherine of Siena. We've had to change a lot. We are being driven by changes where nothing seems the same. I know many are not happy with what is happening.

In 1989, The Judds released a song entitled River of Time. There is one verse that states: *We're all driven by the winds of change, seems like nothing ever stays the same. It's fate that guides me around the bend, life's forever beginning, beginning again. Carry me away and heal my mind, flow on river of time.*

We've had to change a lot BUT God hasn't changed at all. We still need to praise and worship this God who was with us, is with us, and will be with us. Yes, while the time and place of our worship may have to change, our faith and trust should not! This is not the end; we are going around the bend on the river of time to become a newer, stronger, brighter family of God.

surgery, as well, as for the dying. The anointing of the sick unites, the anointed person, more closely to Christ's redemptive passion. By associating with the Lord's passion, the sick contributes through their suffering to their own good and the welfare of all God's people.

The Sacrament of Anointing the Sick will be ministered after all Masses at St. Luke will be on May 31 and June 1.



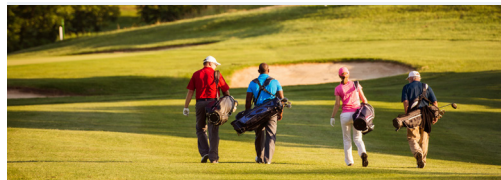

Embracing Change: A Journey of Growth

After discussions with the Parish Council, clergy, and staff, we will be adjusting the Sunday and Daily Mass Schedule.

In light of the announcement that St. Catherine of Siena Parish will not receive a new parochial vicar, and with the reassignment of Msgr. Zuraw and Fr. Cline effective July 1, 2025, we will be left with only one full-time priest. Additionally, a sacramental minister will be available on a limited rotational basis. With six weekend Masses and nine weekday Masses, the demands placed on a single priest and a sacramental minister far exceed anyone's expectations or capabilities.
