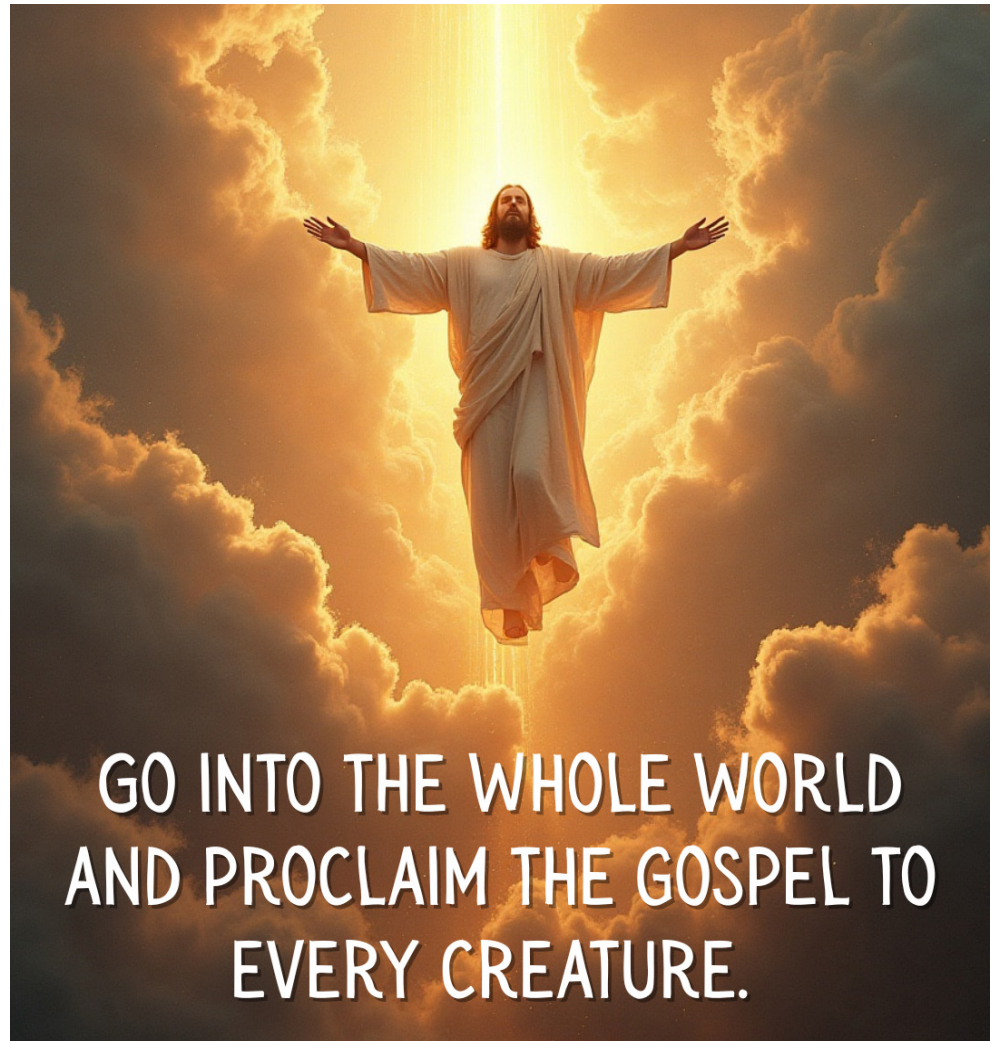
## A Message from DEACON BOB

There is no mention of Jesus' ascension in the gospels of Matthew, or in that of John. This Sunday's gospel from Luke gives us one simple sentence that tells us, "As he blessed them, he parted from them and was taken up into heaven." I wonder what the disciples were thinking at that moment. I would imagine that it might have been natural for them to think "Okay, Jesus is gone, now what do we do?" Jesus didn't leave them an instruction manual, with a step-by-step guide on what to do. It reminds me of my cell phone. An instruction manual? What's that? Figure it out yourself!

But fear not. I've found the instruction manual for life after the Ascension. It's in chapter 16, verse 15, of Mark's gospel. Jesus told his disciples, "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." But wait, there's more! The "instruction manual" is certainly more than just one verse of the Bible. In fact, it is the entirety of both the Old and the New Testaments. It is the entirety of everything that Jesus said and did.

"Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." Jesus' mandate to his disciples must have sounded incredibly impossible at the time. But even more incredible is that they did it! That ragtag band of followers, with so many limitations, and who had abandoned Jesus at the moment of crisis, were now entrusted with the very mission of Jesus himself. And they did it! How did they do it? Through the Holy Spirit. We will be reminded of that at Pentecost next weekend.

Fast forward 2,000 years. Our priests and our pastoral associate are leaving – now what do we do? Here's a simple answer with proven results: "Go into the whole



world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." The gifts and the grace of the Holy Spirit within us empower us to do that. Our mandate is no less important than the mandate given to his disciples at the Ascension. You can call it apostolic action, or discipleship, or evangelization, or witness; call it whatever you want. It's all a part of God's plan for us to cooperate with the many gifts he has blessed us with through the Holy Spirit as we continue to build up his heavenly kingdom here on earth.

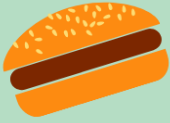
Our reading from Acts this morning tells us that we are to be Jesus' witnesses to the ends of the earth. Well, the ends of the earth are a lot closer than they were at the time of the Ascension. If you have a computer, an email account, or one of those cell phones without a manual, then

the ends of the earth are at your fingertips. If you have a Facebook account, then maybe some of your FB friends would appreciate hearing more about how God is working in your life, rather than sharing about how you dressed up your dog to celebrate its birthday. Try doing that.

The Ascension was the culminating event of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. Now, from his place in heaven, he works with us in our efforts to proclaim the gospel message. So, now what do we do? We work with him.

### Embracing Change: A Journey of Growth

After discussions with the Parish Council, clergy, and staff, we will be adjusting the Sunday and Daily Mass Schedule.

In light of the announcement that St. Catherine of Siena Parish will not receive a new parochial vicar, and with the reassignment of Msgr. Zuraw and Fr. Cline effective July 1, 2025, we will be left with only one full-time priest. Additionally, a sacramental minister will be available on a limited rotational basis. With six weekend Masses and nine weekday Masses, the demands placed on a single priest and a sacramental minister far exceed anyone's expectations or capabilities.

**Saturday 4:30 p.m. Mass at St. Luke:** These intentions will be included in the St. Charles 4:00 p.m. Mass Intentions.

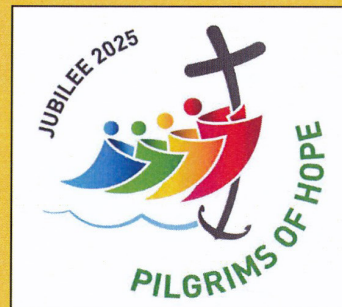

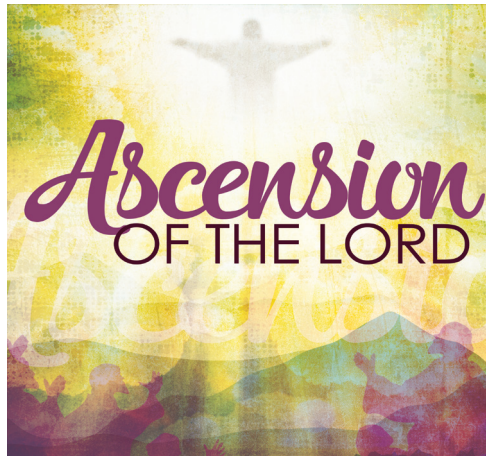
