A Message from DN. MIKE KOCJANCIC SILENCE IS GOLDEN

Originally written for side b on the Ragdoll single, Silence Is Golden was a big hit for Frankie Valli and The Four Seasons and also for the Tremoloes. Many know that phrase comes from the Book of Proverbs, short, traditional sayings that expressed a perceived truth of life. But did you know that there's more to it? The entire proverb is speech is silver, silence is golden. While precious, silver is regulated to second place while first place for gold. In one of my puzzle books, the clue read "Treasure Tokens" and the answer was 'gold coins.'

There is an order of Carthusian monks in France that practice daily silence and solitude, even as they live in community most of their time is spent in their individual cells, only speaking when necessary for practical purposes. With no radio or television, other than common meals, prayer, and the once weekly walk around the countryside, they live a life of solitude, meditation and contemplation in order to connect with the divine.

They definitely are living outside the box. How many of us need constant noise, constant activity, constant contact with others either in person or social media? We are constantly bombarded by noise. I saw a commercial recently advertising an app for different colors of noises like white, which is a soft static sound, pink, the sound of rustling leaves, brown which is a rumbling sound, and green noise, the sound of a stream or ocean. I'm just as guilty as anyone else. I need noise even to sleep, but I can understand



why, as raising four boys usually meant trouble if it was too quiet. Our first reading from Ecclesiastes describes the rat race of the world days of toil and nights of anxiety. The author write tells of having tried everything, all we do is simply chasing after the wind with only death awaiting us. The best wisdom Ecclesiastes could offer for a person is to enjoy life in all its dimensions as a fleeting gift from God. We are encouraged to make most of the time we have. Appreciated the presence of God in each and every passing moment, large and small, loud and silent.

Those monks in France may be onto something. Their entire life is devoted to contact with the divine. They have come to enjoy the beauty of each moment, each raindrop, each snowflake, each sound in their silent world. By losing everything, they gain everything. In the midst of what seems to find a very hectic world, they find peace and solitude.

We are not all called to be monks. Silence is a real luxury

in this noisy world. Spending ten minutes alone in a room might be all we can afford. We have to learn to turn off the radio, the television, the cell phone and to seek the things that are above. I came across a quote recently that said you never learn anything when you are talking. Want to learn about God? Then deliberately keep quiet, go beyond the noise and activity of the world. If we can cut through the vanity of our lives, the vanity that says we must be loud and involved totally with the world in order to be someone, then maybe we can find the gold that the fullness that God has put in every relationship, every experience, and every moment of just being alive. If all we do is make noise and wear ourselves out chasing the world, we will not find the grand silence in the richness of everyday life which God reveals to those who seek the things that are above. And that my friends is golden.

NEW PARISH ENVELOPES BEGINNING IN SEPTEMBER



In mid-August, parishioners of St. Catherine of Siena will receive their new monthly envelope packets. While the envelopes may appear slightly different, our goal is to assist you in understanding the purpose of each envelope as we move forward as one parish. We will continue to explain the monthly envelopes as we move forward. September Envelopes will include the following:

1. Sunday Collection Envelopes

These envelopes contribute to the operational costs of both church campuses.

2. Monthly Donation Blessings Envelope

To help minimize envelope costs, this envelope will feature multiple giving options. It will include checkboxes for you to indicate where you wish your donation to go:

- a. Early Childhood Learning Center These funds support the administrative costs associated with our ECLCs, as well as the housing and utility expenses for both St. Luke and St. Charles ECLC facilities.
- **b. Security -** Contributions to this fund help cover security expenses during all weekend
- c. Capital Fund Donations to this fund enable the parish to maintain and finance improvements for both church grounds.

3. St. Vincent de Paul Envelope

This envelope will be distributed quarterly and will feature two checkboxes: one for the St. Charles St. Vincent de Paul Chapter and another for the St. Luke St. Vincent de Paul Chapter. Funds collected will support the mission of St. Vincent de Paul in the Mahoning County.

4. CCD Envelope

This envelope will be sent out once a year and will also include two checkboxes: one for St. Charles CCD and one for St. Luke CCD. The funds from these envelopes help offset the supply costs for CCD and religious education.

5. Ladies Guild Envelope

This envelope is just for this year, as next year (in August) there will be a combined envelope for the Altar Rosary Society and Ladies Guild Envelope that requests their yearly dues for both ministries.


