



Parishioners' questions about the merger

The majority of us live out our faith in a specific place, at a specific time, with specific people. This is the context in which we enter into relationship with Jesus Christ and his church. Our parish is the way of encountering Jesus with other like-minded people. "Parish" is personal. When members of a parish hear that they are going to merge, immediately questions flood our minds. Here are the questions received this past week along with answers.

Will the organizations at each parish remain separate or will they combine?

Both parishes are blessed with organizations that enhance parish life. A merger invites us to come together by identifying those organizations that are common in both parishes and begin to bring them together as a unified group. With numbers comes strength.

Is it possible that mass times may change?

There is a saying, "Never say never." At this time with the present priest personnel in place, mass times will not change.

If it is decided down the line that one of the parishes will close, will we be given notice?

The simple answer is yes. But to close a church is a very complicated process. According to present Vatican norms, it takes a Grave Cause to close a church. Consultation with the parish council is a necessary step in the process.

Since one church is larger than the other, will the larger parish have more representatives on the parish and finance councils?

No, there will be <u>equal</u> representation from both parishes.

What will the new organizational plan of the parish staff look like?

Staff are necessary for the day-to-day operations of the parish. We have two beautiful facilities that need daily care. Since neither church is closing the present staff will remain. Job descriptions may be amended in the future.

Will each church be permitted to keep its own identity regarding traditions, music ministry, etc.?

Remember our identity as church, is one, holy, catholic and apostolic. Each parish has traditions that will be respected, and together we will create new and lasting traditions.

Will donations made to either church be earmarked for the use of that particular church? Will fundraising monies of each church be earmarked at that church?

The Sunday offering benefits the new parish, one common fund. That being said, there are funds that have been designated for particular use in each of the parishes. The intent of the donor /donation remains for that specific purpose. Fundraising earmarked for a particular project will be used for the project that it was designated for. (Recent examples from St. Charles, Can you Hear Me Now Campaign and from St. Luke, Vision 20/20)

When will both churches know the name of the new parish? How will the new name be Determined?

It is important to follow a process that allows parishioners to be consulted in naming the new parish. Parishioners were invited to submit names for the new parish earlier this summer. These names were collated and soon the list will be published to the parishes along with our new mission statement which is being developed by the transition team. Parishioners will have the opportunity to select their top 3 names and their recommendations will be communicated to Bishop Bonnar. He will formally name our new parish.
