

In today's bulletin is a list of the possible names for our new parish that were submitted by parishioners of Saint Luke and St. Charles. Please read the rationales for each name and select your choice for the new parish name. Saint Charles parishioners are receiving the same list this weekend and they will be asked to do the same thing. The ballots are due in the respective parish offices by Monday, October 7. Please cut the ballot from the last page of the bulletin and drop it in the collection basket next weekend or bring it to mass on Tuesday or Friday or to the parish office during the week. Ballots will be counted and the results will be shared as soon as they are available. The three most suggested names from both parishes will be submitted to Bishop Bonnar for his decision. He will issue an official decree naming our combined parish by mid-November.

A Message From

Our process for moving forward with the parish merger is on track. Currently we are setting up procedures and calendars for the upcoming meetings. We will keep you informed of any updates relative to the merging process. Many of the steps involve Canon Law and Civil law decisions. It will be learning curve for all involved. Thank you to all who have been so supportive of this historical event for both parishes.

This week is rich with feast days of special saints. Today, September 29, the church celebrates the Feast of the three Archangels ... Gabriel, Michael and Raphael. Gabriel was the announcer of good news ... i.e., the Annunciation of Jesus' birth to Mary (Luke 1:26); Michael was the defender of good over evil (Revelation 12: 7-12); Raphael is the healer ... he was sent to Tobiah to heal his blindness so he could see the light of Heaven and receive all good things. (Tobit 12:15). September 30 is the Feast of St Jerome. We owe the translation of the Bible into Latin to St. Jerome. Until his time (about the year 400), the Old Testament was written in Hebrew and the New Testament was in Greek. Only the educated could read and understand it.

<u>October 1</u> is the Feast of St. Therese of the Child Jesus, better known as "The Little Flower". She died at the age of 24 and promised to spend her life in heaven doing good on earth.

<u>October 2</u> is the Feast of our Guardian Angels, the messengers from God who protect spiritual and physical harm.

On <u>October 4</u> we celebrate the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the saint who loved animals and nature. We are reminded of his devotion to all forms of life when we respect and care for all living things. Don't forget our blessing of pets and animals on Sunday, October 6 at 1:00 pm in the garden.



NEW PARISH NAME BALLOT

Suggested name: <u>St. Clare</u> (of Asissi)

Rationale: St. Clare was a close friend and follower of St. Francis of Assisi. She is the founder of the cloistered community of The Poor Clares. Francis permitted her to found a religious house adjacent to the church of San Damiano, Francis's church. Clare lived a simple, austere life. Her body is buried in the Church of Chiara in Assisi, near the Church of San Damiano. There is a monastery of Poor Clare Sisters in Canton, Ohio. Her Feast Day is August 11.

Suggested name: _____ St. Catherine of Siena **

Rationale: She is known for her extensive writing and advocacy for peace and unity in the church after the Great Schism in the late 14th century. She was a force for good. Catherine encouraged Pope Gregory XI to return to Rome after his exile in Avignon (France). She was the second woman (St. Teresa of Avila was the first) to be declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope John Paul II on October 4, 1970. She is known as The Doctor of Unity, which is what we are hoping for in the merger. Her Feast Day is April 29.

Suggested name: ____ Our Lady of Guadalupe *

Rationale: A title of Mary that most Catholics are familiar with. The story of Mary's appearance to the peasant boy Juan Diego in Mexico 1531. She is the patron of The Americas and has a Connection to Spanish and Native Americans. She is the Patron of the Unborn. Her Feast Day is December 12.

Suggested name: <u>Sts. Joachim and Ann</u>

Rationale: Sts. Joachim and Ann were the parents of the Blessed Virgin May and the grandparents of Jesus. They are not mentioned in Scripture but are known by the writings of the early church. They are the patron saints of grandparents. Their Feast Day is July 26.

Suggested name: <u>St. Pius Pietrelcina * (Padre Pio Parish)</u>

Rationale: Not only do we have a nice alliteration of Ps but Padre Pio was said to be able to bi-locate, i.e., be in two places at once. What a better representative can 1 parish have than in 2 locations? His Feast Day is September 23. NB: St. Pius Pietrelcina is Padre Pio's religious name by which he was named a saint.

Suggested name: <u>Resurrection */ Holy Resurrection</u>

Rationale: We are Easter people and believe in the truth of the Gospel that Jesus came back to life to redeem all people and invite all people to follow Him. Feast Day is Easter Sunday and the 40 days after.

Suggested name: <u>Sts. Mary and Martha</u>

Rationale: Mary and Martha were the sisters of Lazarus, whom Jesus raised from the dead. They are often depicted a representing the dual nature of a person's spirituality...the active and the contemplative. However, they are both models of loving service, hospitality and prayer, the hallmarks of Christian Life. Prayer becomes service and service becomes prayer. We are called to "sit at the feet of Jesus as Mary did and to live lives of service as Martha did when she waited on Jesus." These two should blend together without boundaries just as our two faith communities will do. Their combined feast day is June 4.

Suggested name: Blessed Carlo Acutis * *

Rationale: He was beatified in October 2020 and is set to become the Catholic Church's first Millennial Saint. His story seeks to connect with younger generations in a digital age. It will be good for Saint Luke and St. Charles and for future vocations to the priesthood. We are on the verge of a new vision for church, too. He is the patron saint of computer programmers and youth. His Feast Day is October 12.

Suggested name: The Roman Catholic Parish/Community of Boardman

Rationale: We need to preserve the history of Boardman. These two parishes encompass the entire Boardman community geographically. This Feast Day can possibly be Pentecost.

Suggested name: <u>St. Theodora</u>

Rationale: Saint Mother Theodore Guerin (St. Theodora) lived an impactful life that still continues to inspire. She came from France to establish The Sisters of Providence at St. Mary of the Woods in Indiana. She is remembered as a woman devoted to prayer, an educator, caregiver and leader. She was a champion of justice and was empathetic to those who suffered. Her Feast Day is February 11.
