



Sister Mary Alyce


As you may be aware, the St Vincent de Paul Kitchen in Youngstown stopped serving lunches at the Sts. Cyril and Methodius site on September 27. They are in the process of moving their operations to the former St. Stanislaw Church hall. It will be up and ready to operate in a few weeks, hopefully. In the meantime, the St. V de P conference from Saint Luke, St. Charles and a few other parishes are pitching in. The week of Sept. 30 – Oct. 4 Saint Luke helped prepare lunches in our kitchen. Several women baked cookies for dessert and there were about 12 people who stopped over after mass on Tuesday to make sandwiches for packed lunches. The lunch bags for the Kitchen were assembled by Saint Luke conference members and other Saint Luke parishioners who responded to the "cry of the poor". It took an hour and a half to complete our mission. St. Dominic served the lunches that week. We may be asked to help again in a few weeks so you may be asked to help the next time. "What you do for the least of my brothers and sisters, you do for me."

While I'm on the topic of St. V de Paul, I want to let you know that the Thrift Store that so many of us worked so hard to get up and running after so many delays, is doing exactly what it was meant to do. They are keeping the store up and serving 7 days a week; they are also serving the less fortunate through the profit that is being channeled to the pantry and kitchen. The recent Tent Sale that was held in August helped make a profit of about \$16,000, not including advertising costs for the weekend. They are continuing to reach out to parishes with their weekend "fill the truck" collections. This is truly becoming a community endeavor and your support is very much appreciated.

<u>Saint Luke 's gospel</u> begins with words of authenticity about the events in his writings. He cites Theophilus, as a supporter of his writings. Luke also wrote a sequel to his Gospel, the Acts of the Apostles which details the life of the early church after the Resurrection of Jesus. We read this story in the weeks after Easter.

<u>Luke</u> records the announcement of and the births of John the Baptist and Jesus.

<u>Luke</u> probably never saw Jesus in person but he relied on the eyewitness accounts of those who did and the writings of the earlier gospel writers,

Matthew and Mark.

<u>Luke</u> painstakingly recorded as many details that he could verify to help tell the Good News. He was a physician by training so accuracy and truth were important to him.

<u>Luke</u> tied many of the events in his gospel to historical figures: Herod the King, Ceasar Augustus, Pontius Pilate, Joseph of Arimathea.

<u>Luke</u> gives special emphasis to Jerusalem in his gospel. We are all familiar with Jesus' journey to Jerusalem and the many encounters he has along the way.

<u>Luke</u> has a special affinity for the poor, the tax collectors, the Samaritans, the Gentiles and women. <u>Luke</u> is the patron saint of the medical profession, notaries, butchers, painters, sculptors and craft workers.

There is a Bible Study on the Gospel of Luke that we may be presenting sometime in 2025.
