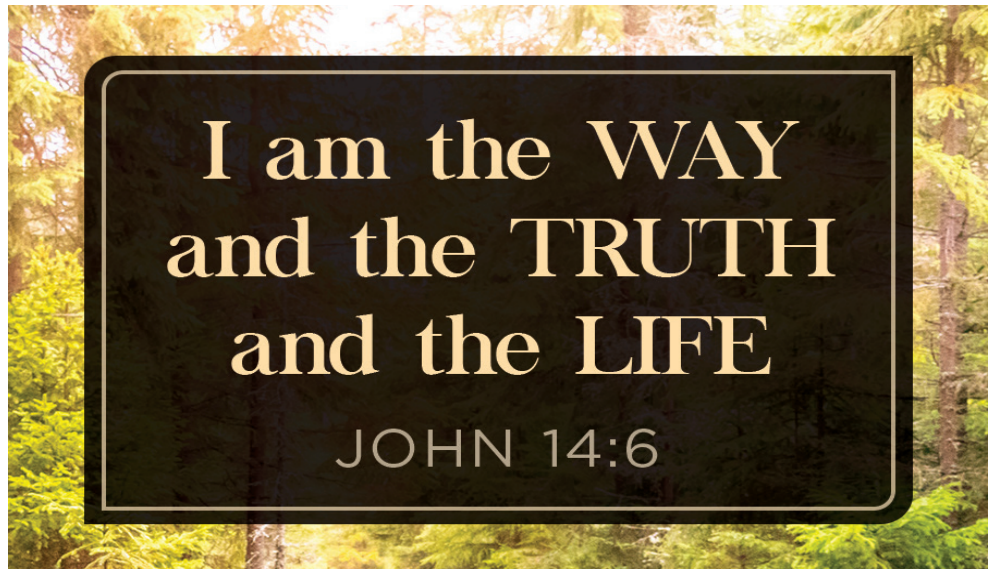


A Message from NATALIE WARDLE

This week, St. Paul admonishes that we are to “proclaim the word”—the truth of the Gospel—“whether it is convenient or inconvenient,” in other words, whether it is popular or unpopular, whether it will gain us acceptance or rejection, win us praise or cost us esteem.

Some truths are easier to speak: “God loves you”; “God is merciful.” Other truths are more difficult to speak because our fallen world finds them much less palatable, particularly truths surrounding sin. But it’s not for us to pick and choose which truths to share. For instance, if we only share truths about God’s mercy, but never share truths about sin, a misunderstanding of compassion and mercy develops. Indeed, we rob God’s mercy of its potency and value if people lack an understanding of sin. Likewise, if we only speak the truth about sin, but not God’s mercy, we deprive people of hope. So, we must proclaim the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth, so help us God. We might as well underscore the last part, knowing how tempting it is to remain silent in our relativistic culture.

Sometimes we avoid proclaiming the truth out of fear of the cost. After all, over 2,000 years ago, the world tried to kill Truth by nailing Him to a cross. Since then, the world—or rather, the evil one operating through it—has tried various other methods, violent and otherwise, to drown out and even silence the truth. Our Lord promised that in the world we would have trouble, but we don’t trust in the rest of Jesus’ promise to “take courage, for I have conquered the world” (Jn 16:33). Rather than accept trouble as an inescapable condition of our discipleship, we shrink from that trouble and do everything in our power to escape it, including



avoiding proclaiming the truth. We don’t want to pick up our cross and follow Him; we do not like the idea of being a sign of contradiction to the world.

But we were not given a spirit of cowardice (2 Tim 1:7); rather, we were given the Spirit of Truth (Jn 16:13). One of the gifts of this Spirit that we’re sealed with at our confirmations is the gift of fortitude, of courage. If we do not open this gift and exercise it daily, we’ll be like the unfortunate steward in Jesus’ parable who buried his talent and drew the ire of his master.

Other times we avoid proclaiming the truth out of a desire to be compassionate. We believe the loving thing to do is not to say anything that might upset or offend anyone. Yet, as I have often explained in youth ministry, “Love without truth is not true love.” When we withhold truth or water it down so as not to offend another, we not only undermine the very love out of which we intend to act (for “love rejoices in the truth” 1 Cor 13:6), but we also do injury to the other person we are intending to love. We have it on our Lord’s authority that it’s the truth that will set us free (Jn 8:32). Thus, depriving another of the light of truth because the brightness of that light might

initially “hurt their eyes,” we unintentionally help to keep them bound in the darkness and slavery of sin. We must remember it’s not the content of the truth that makes our sharing it loving or unloving, but rather our reason for sharing it and the manner in which we do it.

Jesus declared, “I am the way, the truth, and the life.” Granting that “the way” is love, from this I have learned that love, truth, and life are profoundly united. I call it the God equation: love + truth = life. Where love and truth are united, life abounds. “I came so that you might have life and have it to the full” (Jn 10:10). In other words, true love is lifegiving. Abundant life and love require truth.

So, we have no excuse. We must proclaim the truth, in season and out of season. To speak the truth, we must know the truth. To know the truth, we must seek the truth. To seek the truth, we must spend time studying God’s Word and His teachings as handed on through His Church. And we must pray for the courage, as well as the love, to share the truth in a world that is starving for it. Lord, open our lips...

3. Thanksgiving

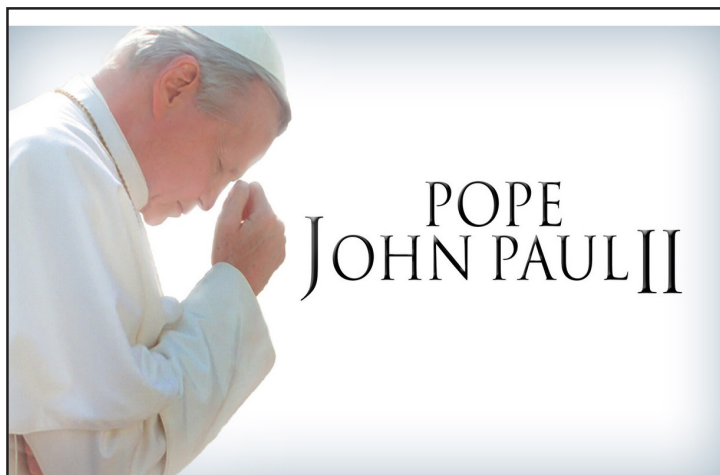
This envelope is distributed once a year for Thanksgiving Mass. The funds collected contribute to the operational costs of both church campuses.

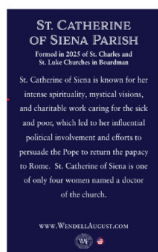
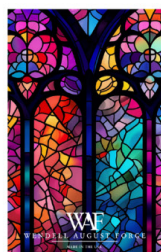

2026 Mass Intention Book SCHEDULING MASS INTENTIONS

If you wish to schedule a Mass in memory or in honor of a loved one, the 2026 Mass Intention Book is officially open.

Due to the merger and the reduction of available Masses, we have implemented new protocols to manage the high volume of Mass Intention requests alongside fewer Masses to schedule.

We kindly ask parishioners to schedule **a maximum of two Mass intentions per person each year**, with only one intention allowed for weekend Masses.

To schedule a Mass Intention, we request that you visit the parish office in person. Payment (in cash or check) for the Mass Intention is required at the time of scheduling.

We appreciate your understanding during this adjustment period. Please consider the needs of other parishioners, as they also wish to remember their loved ones through Mass intentions. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.

MINDING OUR CHURCH BEESWAX

Among the minor things that have to be dealt with when parishes merge, we also try to combine where possible things both sites use in order to be good stewards of our treasure. But besides dealing with practical matters such as costs and delivery schedules, also to consider is what the Church requirements and regulations decree about such implements for use at liturgy, such as candles.

Some may be thinking does it really matter as long as it gives light? Short answer? Yes, it does matter. Candles are symbols of the presence of Christ, the light of the world (John 8:12) and of Baptism by which we share in his light (Col 1:12) and are signs of reverence and festivity. The candle itself was given a mystical meaning with the beeswax symbolizing the pure flesh Christ received from his Virgin Mother, the wick symbolized his soul and the flame his divinity. (*Committee of Divine Worship*, April 2018).

Prior to Vatican II, candles were to be primarily pure beeswax, with the exact percentage determined by the diocesan bishop. However, current legislation is less specific, not providing their exact composition. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops state that candles used at Mass and other liturgical rites must be made of wax and provide 'a living flame without being smoky or noxious.' The document on liturgical architecture (*Built of Living Stone*, no. 93) does not permit 'electric' candles nor oil lamps, with the following exceptions; if a prison or hospital has a policy of absolutely forbidding open flames, the use of electric candles is permitted with the Bishop's authority and oil lamp candles are only permitted for use to indicate the presence of the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle (*General Instructions of the Roman Missal*, no. 316).

So as you can see, it's not just about what is cheapest, but also does it fit liturgical requirements. All documents stress when it comes to liturgy, never settle for second best in anything, even in something that seems so simple as candles.

For 2026, the St. Catherine of Siena Sanctuary Lamps will cost \$15.00 for one week. The St. Catherine and St. Luke Candles will be \$10.00 for one week.

All Saints Day MASS TIMES

The Solemnity of All Saints celebrates those who have committed themselves to Christ and striven to be like him. It includes all who are living and all who have gone before us with the sign of faith. In a more restricted sense, it refers to those whom the Church names as saints and all those unnamed who are with the Lord. We publicly commit ourselves to Christ at our baptism and join a community to strive to follow Christ in all things. Therefore, on November 1, as we celebrate all those who are with God already, our hope is that we too, by being faithful to our baptismal call, may one day join them in complete union with God. This year, due to The Solemnity of All Saints falling on a Saturday, it is not considered a Holy Day Of Obligation.
