

A Message from **ERICA GALVIN**

Lord, I can't do this ...

When I sat down to write this column, surrounded by a mountain of other past due projects, I felt completely overwhelmed, and exclaimed, "Lord, I can't do this." Whether it's writer's block or just my ADHD surfacing, I found it difficult to articulate my thoughts for the column regarding this weekend's scripture readings. My anxiety took control, leaving me frozen, staring at the blinking cursor in my Word document.


LORD... I. CANNOT. DO. THIS.
Then I reflected on how many

times I've uttered that phrase throughout my life, and I know I'm not the only one.

How often have we found ourselves saying or thinking that simple sentence during challenging or overwhelming moments? Especially in times of darkness or when facing significant hurdles. Whether it's a paper due for class, a project deadline at work, a health crisis, family issues, or the loss of a loved one, we frequently turn to God and declare, "I cannot do this..."

I imagined St. Paul writing his letter to Timothy while imprisoned in Rome, fully aware that he was about to face death for his faith. He was in a profoundly dark place, both literally and figuratively. He felt alone. How often do we feel isolated in those dark times, saying we cannot continue?

I remember a conversation with a friend who was battling breast cancer for the second time. To support her fight, we designed, created, and wore



pink ribbon breast cancer shirts and took part in the *Panerathon*. She confided in me, expressing gratitude for our support, yet she disclosed to me that people don't understand that she was the one enduring the chemo and radiation. The toll it took on her body, mind, and spirit was immense. She dreaded her days of treatment and the following days of recovery. Each week, she would lie in bed, overwhelmed, saying, "I cannot do this anymore...' Yet, thinking of her family and friends would motivate her to rise and face her reality. Many times, I wished I could alleviate her fear and pain, even if just for a moment. However, I realized that true peace comes from only one source, and it's not me. St. Paul reassured us, saying, "The Lord will rescue me from every evil threat and bring me safely to his heavenly kingdom." But how do we reach that point? We must look at the preceding paragraph.

"I have competed well; I have

finished the race; I have kept the faith." As I reflected on that line repeatedly, I recognized that St. Paul did not claim to have won the race—he simply finished it.

So, what have I gleaned from all this reflection?

We must keep pushing forward, even when hope seems elusive. We need to complete what we've started, even during our weakest and most vulnerable moments. Even when it feels like we're clawing our way to the finish line, keep clawing. We must hold our faith close and trust that God is by our side no matter what, holding us up when we lack our own strength to carry on.

It is only after we have faithfully completed our race well, that we can truly say we have won. "To Him, be glory forever and ever. Amen."

THANK YOU Lord. I did it.

PARISH ENVELOPES FOR THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER

You should have received your monthly envelope packets for November. If you haven't received the new envelopes and would like to, or if you have received the envelopes but do not wish to, please contact the parish office so we can address the issue. Our aim is to help you understand the purpose of each envelope as we progress together as one parish. *November Envelopes will include:*

1. Sunday Collection Envelopes

These envelopes contribute to the operational costs of both church campuses.

2. Monthly Donation Blessings Envelope

To help minimize envelope costs, this envelope will feature multiple giving options. Please maks sure you mark the checkboxes to indicate where you wish your donation to go:

- **a. Early Childhood Learning Center -** These funds support the administrative costs associated with our ECLCs, as well as the housing and utility expenses for both St. Luke and St. Charles ECLC facilities.
- **b. Security -** Contributions to this fund help cover security expenses during all weekend Masses.
- **c. Capital Fund -** Donations to this fund enable the parish to maintain and finance improvements for both church grounds.

3. Thanksgiving

This envelope is distributed once a year for Thanksgiving Mass. The funds collected contribute to the operational costs of both church campuses.

4. Retired Religous

This annual collection supports the Retirement Fund for Religious, which assists over 20,500 elderly sisters, brothers, and religious order priests who dedicated their lives to service, often receiving little to no compensation. Currently, their communities are struggling to meet their basic care, medication, and daily living needs. Your generosity helps ensure they can age with dignity. Please give in gratitude for their lifelong commitment.

5. Christmas Flowers

This envelope is distributed twice a year, once for Christmas and once for Easter. The funds raised go towards purchasing holiday flowers and other materials to enhance the beauty of the sanctuary throughout the year.

Therefore, on November 1, as we celebrate all those who are with God already, our hope is that we too, by being faithful to our baptismal call, may one day join them in complete union with God. This year, due to The Solemnity of All Saints falling on a Saturday, it is not considered a Holy Day Of Obligation.

Martha's Cupboard Food Pantry AT ST. CHARLES CHURCH

Every month, our dedicated volunteers distribute boxes to over 120 families containing food, laundry detergent, and other essential items that are typically not included in traditional government programs.
