

In case you missed the announcement last weekend, the top three parish names that we are submitting to Bishop Bonnar in November are St. Catherine of Siena, Resurrection and Sts. Mary and Martha. These three names received the highest number of ballots at both Saint Luke and St. Charles, although not in the same order at both churches. To me, this shows the working of the Holy Spirit in our two parishes' discernment of what a proper name for our new parish should be. I hope you plan to come to the REVEAL Celebration for St. Charles and Saint Luke parishioners on November 10 at 1:00 pm. in the Saint Luke Parish Hall and meet some St. Charles folks while you are here. If you know someone from St. Charles, why don't you call them and formally invite them? See the invitation in the bulletin on p. 6 and don't forget to call in your reservation or use the QR code to let us know how many from your family will be attending so we can plan for food and seating.

In Mark's gospel everyone believes he or she can see. Yet when Jesus encroaches on their turf, most react defiantly. Except those healed. In today's gospel, (Mark 10: 46-52) none of them, except Bartimaeus, sees and follows Jesus. Not the scribes and Pharisees, not the disciples who are alongside him, not those who are seeking out his healing. Unlike all those who have come before him, Bartimaeus, the one who begs to see, not only is restored to sight, but is empowered to follow Jesus on the way to life. Mark identifies a process of discipleship in this gospel and Bartimaeus, who is clear about his disability, begs to see, Jesus heals him and he is transformed and follows Jesus. That's how it is with God's grace, once we experience it. If we don't ask with honesty and openness to what God can reveal to us, then maybe we are like everyone else in the story except Bartimeaus, who sees, asks and is transformed. Prayer for Autumn Blessings


