A Message from DAVE FELDEN THE WORK CONTINUES

Now with winter approaching, scheduled outdoor projects and winterization activities completed, priorities shift to indoor projects and repairs needed for the church and school. More on the projects in a later update, but for now let's talk CHURCH LIGHTS!

CHURCH LIGHTS

Background:

Several parishioners have stated "you know there are some lights out in the church". With the time change and especially in the morning, it was easy to see how dark it had become. In August of 2023 all the light bulbs were changed. Those LED lights installed were warranted for three years and were supposed to last for 25,000 hours. Estimating the number of hours the lights were on, the expectation was a conservative seven-to-ten-year life. The lights started failing during the summer of 2025 with three lights failing in one week. The final number of light bulb failures was thirty. It was concluded that, although the bulbs were designed for this type of fixture, excessive heat caused a shorter lifespan.

Maintenance difficulties:

Changing of the church's light bulbs is not trivial and is one of the more challenging maintenance tasks at the St. Catherine of Siena, St. Charles Campus. Although the bulbs screw into sockets (like the light bulbs found in most homes), the fixture type, height and the slope of the floor created logistical difficulties and safety issues. Most of the bulbs are recessed into fixtures which are supported by a self-leveling pivoting drop rod. The pivot portion is either affixed to a beam or the ceiling. The height of the fixtures ranges from thirty feet to forty-five feet. Using an extension pole designed for bulb replacement, two bulbs at thirty feet were able to be replaced. However... Imagine standing on the allowable top rung of a ladder that is positioned on the sloped floor, while lifting a one-pound bulb located at the end of a wobbly twenty-foot plus extension pole which in turn you are trying to steady using both arms. If luck is on your side, after you lift the bulb to the fixture (which is pivoting as the bulb is pushed close to the socket) the bulb magically lines up with the socket (which you cannot now see), allowing you to turn it in. For fixtures



at forty five feet a taller ladder and longer pole is required, creating an even more precarious situation.

Reaching the lights:

The solution to safely reaching and changing the light bulbs requires an electric articulating manlift. Scissor lifts cannot be used as the lift manufacturers do not allow operation on sloping floors due to lift instabilities. The manlift required must be battery operated and capable of traveling through the entry, gathering space, and church doors. Additionally, the manlift needs to have sufficient extension to reach all the lights. The manlift used for the last replacement cleared the doors by one inch on each side. Manipulating this manlift into the church takes a skilled qualified operator and is a process that takes a significant amount of time. Additionally, several pews need to be moved.

Determining replacement lights: When three bulbs had failed in the summer of 2025, four vendors were contacted and invited to present their solutions for lighting the church. As using the same LED bulb was not a good option, vendors were instructed to provide their best lighting solutions. No constraints of light type, fixture type, cost etc.. was given. The goal was to have a solution which would either offer greater longevity or something that could be more easily maintained. Two vendors with their lighting experts indicated that architecturally the same type of fixture should be used unless a different aesthetic was desired. For expedience the option of a new fixture was abandoned. Both presented a bulb replacement that

are designed for enclosed fixtures and have an internal fan to circulate and lower the temperature around the bulb.

Timeline and the process:

So no problem "just order the bulbs and get them installed..." Not so fast The new bulbs and installation cost were above the local spending authority threshold (I cannot disclose the amount, but it's not as large as you think) which required diocesan approval. To obtain approval, the pastor needs to submit a written request to the diocese for permission to spend. The request must include a minimum of three quotes. The request once submitted is then reviewed by the diocese and, if approved, passed onto the bishop for final approval. Although for this type of project, approval is a formality, nevertheless it is not possible to proceed without approval. The final approval was received on Thursday, October 23, 2025, approximately three weeks after starting the approval process. As soon as the approval was received (within one hour), the vendor was informed to proceed. However, the new bulbs chosen were not the "off the shelf variety" and had a two-week lead time. As the bulbs were being procured, the vendor coordinated the manlift rental and manpower. The new lights were anticipated to be installed before the end of November, but are here today. Thanks for your patience and understanding. More to come on other projects and repairs.



You should have received your monthly envelope packets for December.

If you haven't received the new envelopes and would like to, or if you have received the envelopes but do not wish to, please contact the parish office so we can address the issue. Our aim is to help you understand the purpose of each envelope as we progress together as one parish.

December Envelopes will include:

1. Sunday Collection Envelopes

These envelopes contribute to the operational costs of both church campuses.

2. Monthly Donation Blessings Envelope

To help minimize envelope costs, this envelope will feature multiple giving options. Please make sure you mark the checkboxes to indicate where you wish your donation to go:

- **a. Early Childhood Learning Center -** These funds support the administrative costs associated with our ECLCs, as well as the housing and utility expenses for both St. Luke and St. Charles ECLC facilities.
- **b. Security -** Contributions to this fund help cover security expenses during all weekend Masses as well help offset the cost for the expenses for other security systems, such as cameras.
 - **c. Capital Fund -** Donations to this fund enable the parish to maintain and finance improvements for both church grounds.



St. Luke Social Concerns Ministry

Social Concerns Ministry has a history of community outreach at St. Luke. We started with school supplies for the students of St. Luke, coat collection, and helping with utility bills. Then came the Pantry with members making kits for the people who were homeless, making blankets, and collecting household items. When requested, we assisted with Diocesan collections – First Step for Change and Giving Tree, Rescue Mission collection of towels, Ursuline Sisters AIDs Ministry, and Voter Registration with the Board of Elections.

Currently, our main project is the Paper Pantry Plus. This is the oldest Paper Pantry in two counties. While other groups focused on food distribution, we saw a need to supply items that were not covered by the Food Stamp program. Also, one goal was to build relationships with members of the community by seeing them as guests and interacting. In December, guests receive guidelines, dates for next year and a registration form for January using an ID. No proof of need is required. Usually, 65 individuals register for the year, and we have 50 bags to distribute. Those bags contain, four packs of toilet paper, dish soap, roll of paper towels, tissues, and body wash (men/women). They also have the opportunity to choose two of the following: spray cleaner, razors, wet wipes, deodorant (men/women), bar soap, tooth paste, tooth brushes, or shampoo. Bags are distributed on a first-come, first-served basis. The Pantry has one rule that if an individual missed two months in a row, the name is eliminated. This allows openings for others to register. Members of the Social Concerns Ministry shop, and bags are packed the second Tuesday of the month at 5:00 p.m. in the school. Distribution is usually the last Sunday of the month around 8:00 a.m. using a drive-up service.

In 2024, we distributed 5,268 items consisting of paper products, grooming and hygiene products in the bags. An annual report is printed in the Bulletin. The Pantry is funded by the Church community with two envelopes – one in May and one in December. We are grateful for our parish's generous support in order to continue our mission.
